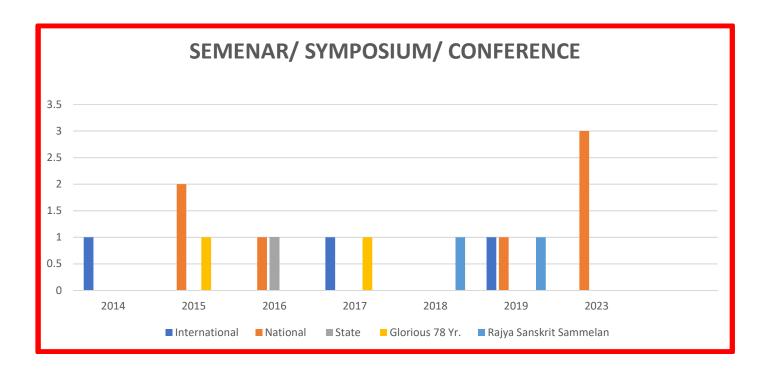

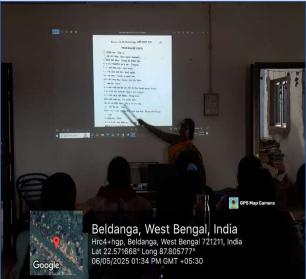

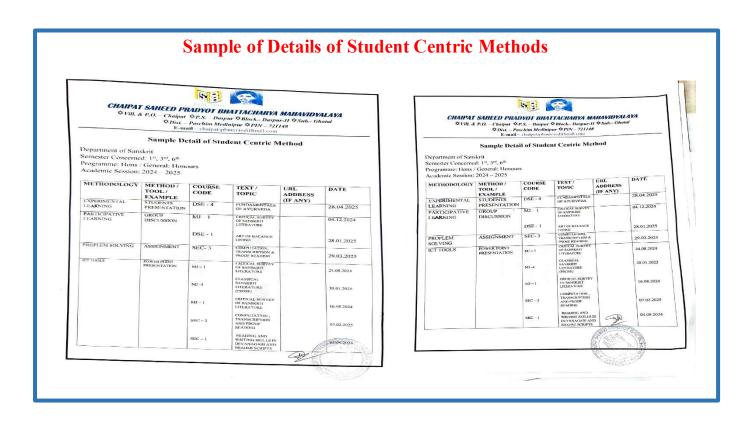

CBCS & CCFUP

The curriculum, prescribed by Vidyasagar University is followed by the department. The faculties of the department ethically believe that curriculum is not simply a means of transacting knowledge but also a medium to inform the students of certain issues which are fundamental for welfare of nation-state. The faculties try to enlighten the students that society, ecology and economics are closely related to human existence which is reflected through and recorded in literature. In their teaching, they incorporate issues which includes professional ethics, gender, human values, environment and sustainability.

Professional ethics: The programmes, taught in the department, consist of courses which are fully or partially dedicated to the issues mentioned above. The university prescribes reading and writing skills in Devanagari and Brahmi scripts and computer application for Sanskrit, computation transcription and proof reading (SEC -01, SEC -02 & SEC -03, 1st, 2nd & 3rd Sem) students (in CBCS and CCFUP pattern) to hone among the Under graduate students' skill computerised Sanskrit which is an essential tool expected by an employer.

Human Values: The NEP:2020 offers provisions for students' engagement in project work through Skill Based Education (SEC). This has not only sharpened their creative faculty but also opened up before them an enormous amount of knowledge. They can add their creativity with data and train themselves to be a researcher in near future. This also inculcates in them the seed of human values in the form of collaboration and cooperation every aspect of Sanskrit literature has human and moral value.

Gender: Call for the equality of gender is the common cry of every sensitive individual. Courses like Modern Sanskrit literature, Human Rights, Gender and Environment, Gender and Violence, Gender and sexuality, Gender Sensitization, educate the students regarding the equal rights of genders in an ideal and healthy society.

Environment and Sustainability: Though the syllabus does not provide any palpable texts centring to environment and sustainability, while teaching the fundamentals of ayurveda, the faculties discuss the importance and impact of environment and natural aspect in our life. Glimpses of the Lecture Series conducted by the Department



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Report on the Lecture Series: "Texts in Eman Manab Jamin Raila Patit, Abad Korle Falto Sona: 2021"

The online lecture "Texts in Eman Manab Jamin Raila Patit, Abad Korle Falto Sona: 2021," conducted by the Department of Sanskrit at the college, was an initiative to acquaint the students with a notable national lecturer and philanthropist across the state. Due to Covid-19 pandemic, the department opted for an online platform (Google Meet). The texts were selected by the students themselves, and they were permitted to express the approach of analysis they would prefer. The respected speakers were requested accordingly, and the lectures focused primarily with the textual nuances. For the convenience of the students, the speakers shared some materials beforehand. Over 60% of the departmental students attained the series. They launched thought provoking queries, and those proved their eagerness and interest. As the detailed schedule of the lecture series was notified on the college website, faculties and students from other departments also joined the sessions. The lectures are available at the college's YouTube channel.

Formal Mechanism for Conducting a Cultural Programme

Department of Sanskrit, Chaipat SPB Mahavidyalaya

1. Planning and Proposal Stage

Plan and preparation: Faculty members or students propose the idea of a cultural programme.

Meeting and endorsement: Internal discussion within the department to finalize a tentative date, theme, venue, and budget (if needed).

Proposal Submission: Submit a formal proposal to the Head of the Institute (Principal) for approval.

2. Approval and Scheduling

Seek Formal Permission: A letter or email is sent to the Principal seeking permission to hold the event.

Approval Received: Once approved, details such as date and venue are confirmed.

Coordination: Form a Cultural Committee (teachers and student volunteers) to execute the plan.

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3. Communication and Participation

Notification: A formal notice is issued inviting student participation.

Include date, time, venue, list of events, and registration instructions

Encouragement: Faculty members encourage students to take part and attend the event enthusiastically.

Registration: Students submit names for events like singing, drama, debate, poetry, dance, etc.

4. Preparation Phase

Rehearsals: Rehearsals and coordination sessions are held for participants.

Logistics: Ensure availability of sound system, stage setup, decorations, certificates, and refreshments (if any).

Anchoring & Schedule: Prepare programme schedule and assign anchors.

5. Programme Execution

Inauguration: Event is inaugurated by the Head of the Institution or Guest of Honour.

Main Programme: Students perform/participate as per schedule.

Documentation: Photos and videos are taken; attendance is recorded.

6. Feedback and Reporting

Feedback Collection: Informal feedback is gathered from students and faculty.

Reporting: A brief report with photos is prepared and submitted to the Principal and archived in the departmental records.

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Flowchart: Mechanism for Conducting Cultural Programme

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SWOC Analysis:

Strength: (S)

Full strength of faculties with immense urge to contribute to the Sanskrit studies, there is a Departmental library, which is moderately furnished with books (according to syllabus and others) and journals related to various branches of Sanskrit studies, available for the students and the teachers.

Department has a yearly wall magazine named "Nirbanam" which published every year by the departmental students.
